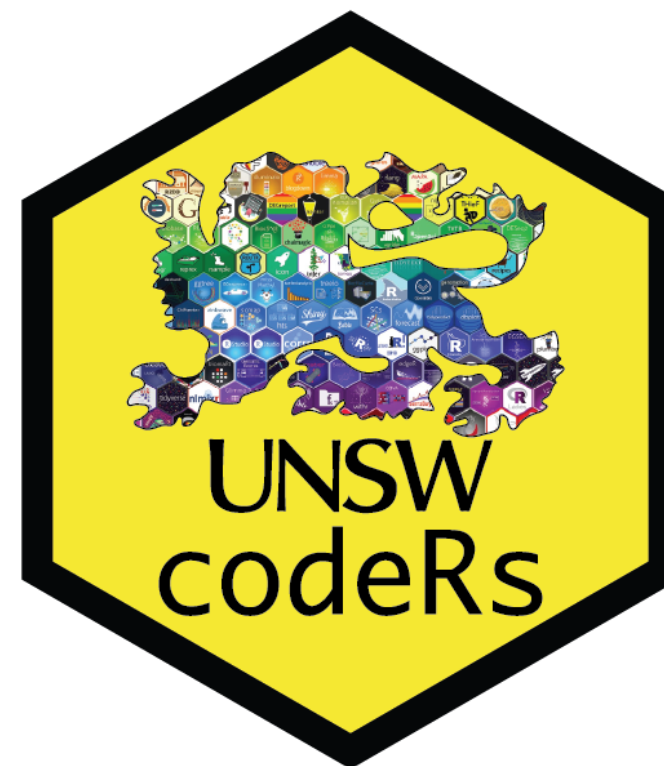

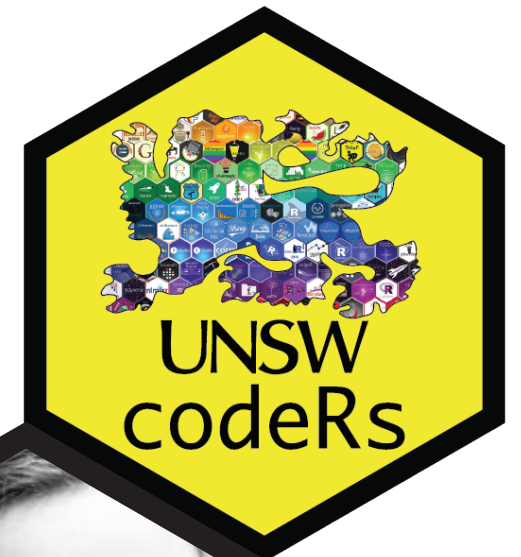

Why should I purrr?

Scientific research is often a “broken record” game: we must repeat the same calculations over and over again. In this inaugural UNSW codeRs workshop, Aniko will teach you how to repeat yourself efficiently in R without using copy-paste. We will take a look at loops, covering the basic building blocks and syntax needed to iterate over data. We will discuss the limitations of loops, and how you can create easily readable code, eliminate clunky loops, and streamline your workflow with the powerful and elegant purrr package, a core package in the tidyverse.
